INFORMATION: The author of this Psalm is David. He was a shepherd who was the son of a shepherd. He was known as the shepherd king. The Shepherd King presented 12 truths about the Chief Shepherd, Jesus Christ.

### VI. Sixth verse (11-12 weeks)
